Standdowns and Suspensions

<u>The guidelines from the Ministry of Education are very clear.</u> Principals need to be aware of all the steps to follow. It is recommended you print a copy of the guidelines and go through them highlighting the key steps and processes that you must follow in the case of a stand down or suspension.

<u>The Ministry has guidance for parents and caregivers</u>, which is useful to share with them when a child has been stood down or suspended, so they understand their rights and the steps they need to take.

Principals have a key responsibility to inform the presiding member of the school board before initiating either a stand down or a suspension. This ensures the board, as a good employer and steward of health and safety requirements, can support the staff should there be a challenge or other repercussions following the decision.
